Learning outcomes: The student achieves a profound knowledge of specialized terminology based on words of Latin and Greek origin in the field of pharmacy. Terminology encompasses terms of pharmacopoeia, names of drugs of botanic origin and their mother plants, chemical substances used in industrial production of medicine, and finally medical terms (mostly of anatomy and pathology). He (she) can make use of it in daily practice and possibly create new terms in his (her) research activities.					
Class syllabus: The lessons concentrate on the mediation of profound knowledge of specialised terminology used in pharmacy, grammatical rules necessary for the comprehension of specialised texts, and principles of formation of special terms based on Latin and Greek languages.
